- Fourteen Mechanical Engineering and Chemical Engineering students from the **Nuclear Power Engineering CX** program completed summer training with the Korea Atomic Energy Research Institute (KAERI), in South Korea as part of an agreement between KFUPM and KACARE. The program included lectures, site visits, and hands-on training at various nuclear installations, providing the students with in-depth knowledge and practical nuclear industry experience. Students were exposed to several aspects of nuclear power generation, starting from the nuclear fuel manufacturing, power plant component manufacturing, to the safe operation of a nuclear power plant to generate electrical power.
