- The University welcomed the **2022 Nobel Laureate in Chemistry, Morten Meldal.** His visit included examining opportunities for cooperation and the exchange of novel ideas. Prof. Meldal also delivered a seminar where he shared insights into his scientific journey and career.
- The University celebrated the inauguration of its **Mining Science and Engineering Program**, which was established in collaboration with the Ministry of Industry and Mineral Resources and Ma'aden Company. The ceremony received esteemed guests such as H.E. Bandar Al-Khorayef, Minister of Industry and Mineral Resources; H.E. Eng. Khaled Al-Mudaifer, Vice Minister of Mining Affairs; and Robert Wilt, the President of Ma'aden Company.
- The University hosted the inaugural Saudi International Conference on Nuclear Power Engineering (SCOPE), aimed at developing human and research capacities in the field of nuclear engineering for peaceful applications. SCOPE provided a forum for professionals and students to enhance their knowledge of the latest innovations and developments in nuclear technology.
- **Two teams** composed of students from the ICS department and one from the COE department secured **first and second place** in the **Gulf Programming Competition (GPC)** in Muscat, Oman. The competition drew participation from 63 teams across five countries.
- The IRC for Advanced Materials organized a 5-day workshop titled **"Finite Element Analysis for Nonmetallic Composite Casing and Tubing"** in collaboration with Saudi Aramco, Ansys, and Fluid Codes. It showcased a gathering of professionals and international companies, enhancing the dialogue on composite materials in the energy industry.
- The **Pre-College Program** application is now open. The program allows **high-school students in** grades 11 and 12 to experience university life and receive a course equivalency certificate.
- The Accounting and Finance Department celebrated **International Accounting Day** with training opportunities and prizes for students.
- The WFAA (Wildfire Assistance Application) team secured second place in the NASA International Space Apps Challenge, a hackathon to create solutions to challenges faced on Earth and in space.
- The University has inaugurated a series of **campus tours**, inviting the public to witness its cultural diversity and academic life up close. This move signals the beginning of an effort to foster deeper connections with the broader community.
- The Department of Physical Education organized a 5 Km **"Walk for Health"** with more than 1,300 university participants, including students, professors, employees, and graduates.
