- Dr. Umair bin Waheed, Associate Professor of Geophysics in the Department of Geosciences, has
 received the 2024 Society of Exploration Geophysicists (SEG) Outstanding Educator Award. SEG
 is the international flagship society for geophysicists. Official recognition of his award will take
 place during the IMAGE conference in Houston.
- The Chemistry Department organized its Annual Graduate Student Competition. A panel of
 industry judges, from Saudi Aramco and Halliburton, was led by Prof. Theis Ivan Solling, Director,
 Center for Integrated Petroleum Research. The top three winners were awarded certificates and
 cash prizes.

 public speaking champions from around the world. The event reflects KFUPM's growing culture
 of public speaking. Topics ranged from following our dreams, to rising above challenges, and
